## *Crafted Prayer Guide for Groups*

(ADAPTED FROM THE BOOK: *Crafted Prayer*)

Gather a group of believers who have New Covenant perspective of God's true nature and His faithful, unchanging nature of goodness and grace.

Together, begin with thanksgiving and worship of who God is for us, to us and through us. Come into stillness. Rejoice with each other that He promised to always be with us.

Clarify and simplify your focus for your prayer so that everyone understands it. Ask the Lord to show you His perspective with expectation and thanksgiving. How does He see this? How is He thinking about it?

Ask the Lord to show you the desires and prayers of the Father, Jesus and the Holy Spirit regarding your prayer focus. Rejoice that they are already praying their prayer in you!

During your individual time, gather thoughts, words or scriptures that bubble up from your heart and write them down. This is a time to collect the pieces. No rush to connect them. If time permits, go to different places alone and begin to listen - or everyone can listen on their own for several days before you come together again with your notes.

Come together as a group and share the words, phrases, promises and/or scriptures you believe God has revealed to you. Do you notice any common words or themes?

Record these common words, phrases and scriptures. Give copies to each person in the group. Individually, take these common thoughts and words to the Lord and pray for further clarification.

When you come back together, enter that place of stillness. Begin to craft a prayer together.

Take your completed, group-crafted prayer back to the Lord for any further clarification.

With your prayer, move into a time of **proclamation** of what God will do. Be creative in ways of praying your prayer aloud together and individually. Give your whole heart to it and rejoice in the fact that God is faithful to do things in His own time and in His own way.

Remember, that the joy is in the journey of crafting your prayer and praying with God... not only in the outcome. Therefore, you will always have a cause for rejoicing in prayer!

Ask God to show you when the resolution has come.
